

## *Liberal Arts–A.A. Degree*

The Liberal Arts curriculum is designed to prepare the student for transfer to a four-year institution. A student in the Liberal Arts program has the opportunity to gain academic confidence by taking courses in a small, personalized, nurturing environment. The courses in the Liberal Arts curriculum are designed to develop the student's reading, writing, communication, scientific, and mathematical skills while at the same time laying a foundation of cultural literacy.

A faculty advisor and transfer counselor work closely with each student in designing a program of study best suited for that individual's future academic interests. The student who intends to complete formal education at Manor with an Associate Degree will develop oral and written communication skills, interpersonal skills, and problem-solving and critical thinking skills which are highly desirable in today's competitive world.

The student must maintain an overall grade point average of 2.0 for all courses.
