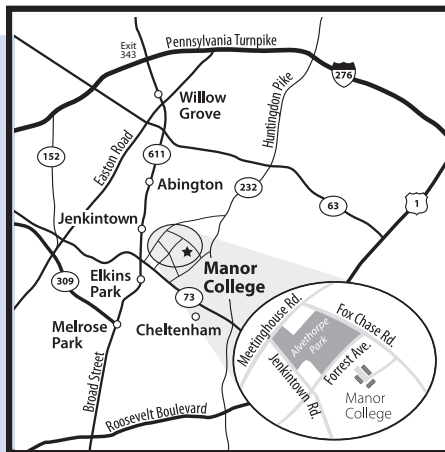

### Directions from MaSt:

#### *By Auto*

From MaSt, turn left onto Byberry Road. Turn left on Philmont Ave. and go to Huntingdon Pike (Rt. 232). Turn left onto Huntingdon Pike and go to Cedar Rd. Turn left on Cedar Rd. and go to the first light at Fox Chase Rd. Turn right onto Fox Chase Rd. and go to the first light and turn left into Manor College's parking lot.

#### *By Bus*

From MaSt, go to Roosevelt Blvd. (Rt. 1) and Byberry Rd.  
Take the #14 Bus south to Rhawn St.  
Transfer onto the #28 Bus (west).  
The #28 Bus stops in front of Manor College at Fox Chase Rd.

## What is this gift?

Basically, and simply said, it is an amazing opportunity for you to earn college credit and high school credit at the same time for the same course.

For instance, instead of taking English at MaSt Community Charter School, you can take Fundamentals of Composition I (EN101) at Manor College.

You will receive 3 college credits for this course from Manor plus credit at MaSt Community Charter School.

## Who qualifies?

- High School seniors
- Honor Students and AP Students who have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher and a Verbal (Critical Reading) score of 500 on their PSAT exam.
- Those students recommended by their high school counselor.
- Students with a 90% attendance record in their junior year
- The student who is ambitious, diligent, and motivated.
- The student who is willing to walk through the door of opportunity that Manor College is opening.

## Who pays for this?

The Philadelphia School District is providing the funds for this special program with Manor College.

## What is the benefit?

This is an opportunity that no eligible student should reject. Essentially, it is free tuition for college credit taken during your senior year of high school. This allows a student to accrue college credit that will transfer to Manor or any other college or university.

This will save you valuable time and money once you graduate from high school and begin college. You will have the potential to earn an Associate Degree or a Baccalaureate Degree in less time.

Additionally, this program will allow you the opportunity to take courses related to a career you may be interested in, but somewhat unsure about entering.

For instance, if you are interested in becoming an attorney, you may take a course such as “Critical Thinking” or “Intro to Law.” If you’re interested in the field of medicine, then take “Survey of Anatomy and Physiology.” If you’re interested in a business course, then take “Accounting” or “Intro to Business” and so on.

Manor College finds this as an excellent approach to exploring careers.
